Subject: Israel-Lebanon Crisis

Sponsors: Dominican Republic, People's Republic of China, French Republic, Republic of Indonesia, South Africa, and United Kingdom,

Signatories: Estonia, Germany

The Security Council,

Noting the Charter of the United Nations (UN) that calls for the preservation of peace as outlined in Chapter I,

Recalling previous resolutions by the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) including but not limited to S/RES/1701, S/RES/1559, S/RES/1553, S/RES/1525,

Deeply concerned by the ongoing conflicts in the Israeli-Lebanese border despite the presence of the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL),

Acknowledging the effects of violence within the borders of Israel and Lebanon and the rising amounts of destruction within large civilian regions,

1. *Calls for* an immediate ceasefire in the Israeli-Lebanese border by all Member States and non-state actors in the involved region, including:
 - a. Instilling an immediate ceasefire in effect for 72 hours along the borders of Israel and Lebanon,
 - b. Invoking economic sanctions for violations of this ceasefire in pursuance of Chapter 7 of the UN Charter, and,
 - c. Directing 4,346 additional UN peacekeeping troops to UNIFIL to enforce the ceasefire to the maximum of 15,000 allotted troops;
2. *Creates* a roundtable discussion to occur virtually with Member States approved by the President of the UNSC and to take place during the ceasefire to discuss extending the current ceasefire along the Israeli-Lebanese border;
3. *Approves* the use of resources from the Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) in delivering medical aid and emergency relief following attacks from the Israeli-Lebanese conflict by:
 - a. Establishing temporary field hospitals to treat the injured,
 - b. Providing food, water, and medical supplies to be distributed by UNIFIL peacekeepers in region alongside OCHA agent along the Israeli-Lebanese border,

- c. Facilitating evacuations to be conducted by UNIFIL peacekeepers along the Israeli-Lebanese border to help civilians flee from the ongoing violence at the discretion of the UN Department of Peacekeeping Forces, and,
 - d. Rebuilding damaged water infrastructure and supply routes in the aforementioned regions as determined by the United Nations Development Programme's Funding Facility for Stabilization;
- 4. *Condemns* any further military action by any Member State or non-state actors along the Israeli-Lebanese border as listed below, including but not limited to,
 - a. Violations of Article 39 of the UN Charter,
 - b. Any aggression as defined by the United Nations General Assembly A/RES/29/3314, and,
 - c. The mobilization of troops within or towards the Israeli-Lebanese border;
- 5. *Invites* a UN-approved investigation led by INTERPOL of the bombing of the Israeli Embassy in Greece, in cooperation with Hellenic Police and the expressed consent of the Government of Greece to take place immediately; and,
- 6. *Creates* a summit of Member States with the Member States of the UNSC to discuss the security issues in the Israeli-Lebanese border, in which:
 - a. Member State representatives are to be decided and approved by the President of the Security Council,
 - b. Shall first convene on the 15th of April, and,
 - c. The first meeting shall be virtual, subsequent meeting locations and dates as to be determined by the summit members.
